Student grade level: High school (but some middle school students can do this!)

Average homework time per day (4 days): 30 minutes per day

Prerequisites: Art 1—or at least some prior experience in art!

Course description:

Building on a foundation of basic art skills, this course will focus on actually creating art and increasing their skills and experience. Students will delve deeper into drawing with pencils, charcoal, pastels, and ink. They will learn to paint with watercolors and oil paints and to approximate both styles using acrylics. Students will sculpt in a variety of styles using several kinds of clay and other sculpting tools. They will create multiple mixed media pieces that take all they are learning to an even deeper level of skill and creativity.

• Internet Access - Mr. Pryor will send out weekly email updates and post the entire course on Canvas, and he will recommend several Youtube videos and require some online research along the way.

Art 3 (1 hour course) - John Pryor

Cost per year (non-refundable): \$220 Cost breakdown per semester: \$110

Textbook: This course draws information from multiple textbooks, websites, and other sources, all of which will be fully credited along the way, but there is no central textbook to purchase.

Grade level: High school, but experienced younger artists are welcome, too.

Average homework time required per day (4 days): 30 minutes per day

Prerequisites: Ideally, Art 1 and Art 2. Artists with similar training and skill level are also welcome.

Course description:

Art 3 will build on the foundations of Art 1 and Art 2 and truly challenge young artists to reach their full potential. It will be presented in a chronological format that explores major art eras and influential artists throughout history while creating great art every week. (For example, we'll paint realistic, light-focused oil portraits while studying Rembrandt.)

Additional requirements:

- Internet access Mr. Pryor will post the entire course on Canvas and occasionally send email updates. Students will also be challenged to do additional research online about the eras, artists, and styles covered.
- A comprehensive list of art supplies needed will be provided at registration. Mr Pryor will bring some
 art supplies to share at each class, but all students are expected to provide their own art supplies along
 the way.

NOTE: At the beginning of each semester, Mr Pryor will provide each student with an organized 3-ring binder containing all the handouts for that semester. These will include everything they need to take notes, practice, etc., as well as the list of art supplies, art examples, and more.

Course description:

This chemistry course will cover basic chemistry concepts such as the properties of matter, the periodic table, stoichiometry, chemical bonding, thermodynamics, solutions, kinetics, and equilibrium. In addition to preparing students for college chemistry, the class will stress practical aspects of chemistry in our everyday lives. Classes on Monday will consist of lecture and demonstrations/labs. Students will read the text and work problem sets on their own during the week. A more detailed syllabus will be provided prior to the beginning of class.

*The math in chemistry requires a thorough understanding of Algebra I. Students who struggled with Algebra I may want to delay taking chemistry until they have had another year of algebra.

Student grade level: 10th - 12th grade

Average homework time required per day (4 days): 1-2 hours per day, depending on student's reading level

Prerequisites (if any): None

Course description:

This is a literature and writing class that is aimed to prepare upper-level high school students for a freshman-level college English course. Assignments will focus on literary analysis, writing development, and rhetorical methods. Course content will emphasize the value of critical analysis and clear communication in daily life. Students should come prepared to engage with and respond to literature and classroom topics, both verbally and in writing. They should already have a good foundation in grammar since the focus of the course is on strong writing and not basic mechanics. Students should also be prepared to demonstrate proper research methods and to give an oral report on a research topic.

Other required resources:

- Folder or binder (does not need to be course-specific)
- Loose-leaf paper for notes or occasional in-class writing
- Pens or pencils
- Internet access and access to a word processor and printer



Criminal Law (1 hour course) - Kristin Garratt

Cost per year (non-refundable): \$280

Cost breakdown per semester: \$140 (\$20 of which covers the copy fee.)

Student grade level: 9th-12th

Average homework time required per day (4 days): 30 minutes + per day (meaning 2-4 hours per week)

Prerequisites: 9th grade reading and writing level.

Course description:

Students will be introduced to an overview of the criminal justice system in America and the underlying principles, constitutional amendments applicable to the criminal justice system, the difference between federal and state laws, various types of crimes and defenses, elements of a crime, parties to a crime, the processes a prisoner is subjected to in the adult criminal justice system, an overview of what occurs during a criminal trial, as well as an introduction to criminal psychology. Whenever time permits, videos will be used to enhance the learning experience. In addition, students will learn how to review a court decision and will be challenged to solve cases and arrive at judicial decisions from real cases. We will engage in a couple of classroom activities to enhance the learning experience. Quizzes will be conducted periodically to determine the students' level of comprehension. A test will be given during the spring semester which will be proctored by the parents.

NOTE TO PARENTS: Discussion of criminal behavior normally involves the discussion of sinful behavior. In this class, sin will be presented as a perversion of what God intended and never as acceptable, even though at times sinful behavior is legal. Please decide before enrolling if you want your child to be exposed to criminal behavior.

Course description:

The year wraps up with a formal debate. Quizzes will be given periodically to test comprehension levels.

Course description:

This course is primarily intensive instruction. Students will be challenged to use Socratic reasoning to critique the six most common worldviews in Western Civilization: Christianity, Islam, Secularism, Marxism, New Spirituality, and Postmodernism. Those worldviews will be analyzed within the context of theology, philosophy, ethics, biology, psychology, sociology, law, politics, economics, and history. Each week's homework assignment includes a small reading passage to analyze and an hour long video to watch with accompanying questions to answer. Midterm and final exams will be taken at home for parents to proctor.

NOTE TO PARENTS: Discussion of behavior outside the norms of Christianity is discussed in this class. Sin will be presented as a perversion of what God intended and never as acceptable. Examples of topics that may be of concern to you are alternative lifestyles, BLM, CRT, and a variety of satanic practices (especially as seen in current culture). Please decide, before enrolling, if the content is appropriate for your child.
